Dr. Carl Falsgraf, who holds a doctorate in linguistics, is the director of the Center for Applied Second Language Studies (CASLS), a National Foreign Language Resource Center at the University of Oregon. At CASLS, he designed and directed the development of the Standards-based Measurement of Proficiency (STAMP).

Dr. Falsgraf is nationally known for his work on standards-based education and proficiency testing. He also directs the Oregon Chinese K-16 Flagship, a partnership with Portland Public Schools to develop Superior-level speakers of Chinese. He has served as President of the Pacific Northwest Council for Languages (PNCFL) and has served on the Executive Board for the American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages (ACTFL).

JO SANDERS

Jo Sanders, immediate Past President of the American Association of Teachers of German, has been teaching German adsffor over 40 years. Although she has 32 years teaching experience at the high school level, she has taught a variety of levels, from pre-school to college. Her teaching has been recognized with the Walt Disney Salute

to American Teachers Award, the AATG Outstanding German Educator in the US Award, the Florence Steiner Award (the highest national honor given for leadership in foreign language instruction) and the Bundesverdienstkreuz, given by the Federal Republic of Germany. Her high school just celebrated the thirtieth year of their partner school exchange, which has encompassed over 1000 students. Her current project is founding a German immersion school for grades K – 8 in Anchorage, Alaska.

From Central and Eastern Kentucky via I-64 West:

I-64 West to Louisville to the River Road/Third Street Exit (exit 136C). Go straight on Third Street to Jefferson Street. Turn right onto Jefferson Street. The Hotel Motor Lobby Entrance will be immediately on your left.

From Northern Kentucky via I-71 South:

I-71 South to I-64 West Louisville to the River Road/Third Street Exit (exit 5B). Go straight on Third Street to Jefferson Street. Turn right onto Jefferson Street. The Hotel Motor Lobby Entrance will be immediately on your left.
